

Nord Stern COVID-19 Protocols for Club Events

Nord Stern is committed to providing a safe and healthy track event for all our volunteers, workers, participants, family, and visitors. To ensure we have a safe and healthy event, Nord Stern has developed the following COVID-19 protocols in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our goal is to mitigate the potential for transmission of COVID-19 at our events and that requires full cooperation among our volunteers, workers, and participants. Only through this cooperative effort can we establish and maintain the safety and health of all persons attending our events.

Nord Stern's COVID-19 protocols follow the industry guidance developed by the state of Minnesota, which is based upon Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) guidelines for COVID-19, Minnesota Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MNOSHA) statutes, rules and standards, and Minnesota's relevant and current executive orders.

In general:

- Ensuring sick volunteers, workers, participants, family, and visitors stay home or otherwise denied participation;
- Enforcing social distancing guidelines that people maintain at least six-feet apart whenever possible in public places;
- Masks are to be worn in public places where it is difficult to stay 6-feet away from others. An exception can be made for immediate household family members when clustered together while maintaining the social distancing guidelines; e.g., cars, trailers, camping, working on vehicles, etc.; and
- Attendees should bring sufficient hand sanitizer and disinfectant supplies for everyone in their group: family, support staff, drivers, etc.

Event Registration

Wherever possible, event registration will be completed online using ClubRegistration.net. This includes the virtual signing of the event participation waiver, the PCA communicable disease waiver, and the identification of family and guests as requested by the Registrar for the respective event.

At event check-in registered participants may be required to show a valid ID to verify registration and, if required, pre-registered family and guests. Unlisted participants will be required to sign the required waivers – event liability and communicable disease – before being allowed to attend and/or participate.

Events that require the use of wristbands to identify proper registration beyond general admission, will have those wristbands distributed by the Registrar at the registration table.

Driver Meetings

Events that require driver meetings – driver education, rallies, and tours – will have either an on-site driver meeting using the required social distancing directives or a virtual driver meeting that uses documented safety and operational guidelines for the event, an online presentation that is required viewing, or a combination of both. Virtual driver meetings may be followed up with an on-site driver meeting using a Q&A format.
