

We all remember the excitement, nerves and many questions involved with one's first track weekend, so hopefully this guide will lend a hand in preparing you for a great weekend!

WHAT IS HPDE??

HPDE is High Performance Drivers Education or DE for short. These events are non competitive, untimed, driving schools held on dedicated race tracks designed to teach Porsche owners proper high speed driving techniques.

You will be assigned a PCA instructor for in car instruction. At no time will you be out on the track on your own. You will start out as a novice student (Green group), progress to an advanced student (Blue group) and from there on to a White solo driver, then perhaps an advanced Black solo or an advanced Pink solo driver.

The amount of time any one driver spends in the Green novice group or the Blue advanced group will depend on a number of factors as each run group has specific requirements that must be met or exceeded in order for a driver to receive a promotion to a higher run group. This is applicable for all the run groups – regardless of experience level. Expect the progression to be at least a few weekends in each of the student groups.

Our on-track time is divided up by run groups and split equally between all the run groups, rotating throughout the day. A typical weekend will provide each run group with 4 x 30-minute sessions of on track time per day. We take a one-hour break for lunch at approximately mid-day. Bring your own lunch or purchase something from the onsite "Track Shack" restaurant kiosk. During the lunch break we offer slow speed parade laps behind a pace car, with donations collected for our charity "Ready for Life". This is the ONLY time you may take passengers in your car on the track.

Many participants will arrive the evening before the event (e.g., Thursday for 3-day events, Friday for 2-day events) and we can usually enter the track at, or before, 5 pm (this varies depending on



who has rented the track for that day). The gate will then stay open for our participants 24/7 throughout the weekend. There are several hotels in the area, including Hotel Seven directly at the track. All overnight accommodation arrangements are your own responsibility.

We recommend you arrive no later than 7 am on Saturday and Sunday. If your initial arrival is the day of the event. You have from about 7 am to 7:30 to unload, set-up, register and get your car through inspection, so be prepared to move quickly and efficiently! You'll have a long day ahead of you, so if you are able, we suggest arriving the day before to set up and get registration and tech inspection out of the way - the morning is a lot less frantic, and you will be better rested.

Please note that all participants MUST BE at least 18 years of age and hold a valid driver's license!

THINGS YOU WILL ABSOLUTELY NEED:

- A car that has been inspected by a Porsche dealer or an authorized shop within the 30 days leading up to the event (Approved Shop List provided by Suncoast PCA at time of registration confirmation or before-hand by request of registrant).
- A tech inspection form, fully filled out by a qualified mechanic, personal information filled in and signed by both the driver and mechanic (Tech Form provided by Suncoast PCA at time of registration confirmation or before-hand by request of registrant).
- Helmet (Snell Rated SA2015 or SA2020). Moped and motorcycle helmets are not allowed and we do not provide loaner or rental helmets.
- A tow hook.
- Lug nuts torqued to spec TRUST NO ONE. EITHER DO IT YOURSELF OR WATCH YOUR
 MECHANIC DO IT.
- Static cling or magnetic numbers, or painters' tape, for applying the number on your car.
 (Numbers are not reserved and are assigned for each event, on a first-come-first-served basis.).
- A valid driver's license.

A Guide for the Newbies!

That's it. Really. You probably have a much longer list in your head of things your car needs to be

"track prepared", but your Porsche, right from the factory, is often far more prepared for this

event than we are - it was built for this! Lots of folks use their "daily driver" with regular street

tires, other folks have fully race prepped cars – to each their own.

ARRIVING AT THE TRACK:

To enter the track, you must first stop at the gatehouse by the bridge, sign a track waiver and

receive a wristband. Then proceed over the bridge towards the large structure which houses the

pit stalls and race control in the tower. If you did not reserve a pit spot, you can set up on most of

the grassy areas or on the massive concrete area to your right (the paddock) when you cross the

bridge.

REGISTRATION AND TECH INSPECTION:

Once you have arrived at the track, you must register and have your car inspected before going

out on track. GO TO REGISTRATION FIRST, THEN PROCEED TO TECH INSPECTION.

Track registration and tech inspection are typically open the evening before the event, from 5-ish

to 7-ish pm, and the mornings of the weekend, starting at 7 am. On most weekends, registration

takes place at the base of the grandstand tower with tech inspection set up nearby. Exact times

will be listed in the event schedule e-mailed to you a few days before the event.

All waivers should have been signed electronically in Clubregistration.net before the event. At

registration, this will be verified, and you receive the wristband of your run group (i.e., Green,

Blue, White, Black or Pink; instructors also receive an Orange wristband). If you have minors

(anyone under 18 years of age is considered a minor), have them come with you to registration

as you will need to sign additional waivers for them, and they will need minor wristbands.

TECH INSPECTION: <u>COME PREPARED!</u>

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The tech inspection station is often easily located by either following the signs or just looking for a line of cars; it is usually located just past the fuel station. We are trying to move cars through the inspection line as efficiently as possible, so please come prepared, stay with your vehicle and keep the line moving.

BEFORE you come to the tech inspection station, your vehicle should be ready to go out on track. This means:

- Your tow hook must be installed car (yes you have a tow hook! It's in the car's tool bag....).
- Your assigned car numbers must be on each side of the car and on the rear of the car (you can use painters tape if you do not have magnetic or vinyl numbers).
- Helmet out of the bag and sitting on your front passenger seat.
- All items out of the car! This includes floor mats, coins, glove box contents, spouses/significant others... and thoroughly inspect for any items under or behind the seats. If it is not firmly affixed to the vehicle, get it out! Bring a Ziploc bag or similar to put your important glove box contents into when you empty your glove box.
- If you are driving a convertible with the top down or a vehicle that does not have a roof, arm restraints are required, roll bar, or not.

We inspect the vehicle to make sure you prepared your car properly. This means:

- Give your signed and FULLY completed tech inspection form to the tech inspector. (You
 must have filled in the personal information including your driver's license expiration date
 and signed it!).
- The tech inspector will make a short check of your car to include various items on their checklist including your tow hook is installed, your car numbers are on and match the number you were assigned, and your helmet has the current SA rating.
- They will then place a sticker at the top left corner of your windshield to confirm your car has been through inspection and is ready for the track. Don't leave without a sticker!



LAST STEP!

After tech inspection, all students are directed to line up their vehicles in the "hot pits" in preparation for the orientation lap that takes place immediately after the morning drivers meeting (note - helmets are not required for the orientation laps). Leave your car in the hot pits and proceed to the base of the tower for the MANDATORY drivers meeting and to be matched up with your PCA assigned instructor.

Students will also have mandatory classroom sessions to attend each day they drive – times and locations are noted on the final event schedules.

Then . . . Have fun!!!

FAQ Summary:

Yes, we drive in the rain. Our events run rain or shine so come prepared as we do not shut down unless the Sebring facility shuts down – which is very rare.

Yes, we have a cancellation policy. It is part of your registration process, please ensure you read it fully and understand it before you sign that you agree.

Yes, we have restrictions on clothing and footwear. No open toed shoes, no flip flops or sandals, no hiking boots, preferred are flat soled shoes like a tennis shoe, cotton clothing is preferred, shorts and short sleeves are acceptable, sleeveless tanks and tops are not acceptable.

Yes, your guests are welcome. We are a private event so only those on the guest list will be admitted.

No, we do not allow passengers in the cars during any hot lap sessions. Passengers are only allowed in the lunch time parade laps (slow speed behind a pace car).
